In 1915 Vera Brittain abandoned her studies at Oxford to enlist as a nurse in the armed services, after her fiancé Roland went to the front. She served in London, Malta, and in France on the western front and saw the horrors of modern warfare firsthand; by war's end she had lost Roland, her brother Edward, and two of her best friends. Her 1933 memoir adapted into a major motion picture starring Alicia Vikander and Kit Harrington is both a record of what she lived through and an elegy for a vanished generation. "It would seem enough that Vera Brittain's autobiography is an honestly gut-wrenching love story, a haunting account of her romance with a brilliant young soldier who died at the front in World War I. Testament of Youth is her tribute to her beloved warrior, but it is also an insightful and beautifully written record of her world before, during, and after the war. As the book begins, Vera Brittain is a young woman determined to free...
